This table is designed to help you identify the unique resources that each partner can contribute.

What **contacts** can we contribute to the partnership – spheres of influence we have or sources of credibility?

What **knowledge** do we bring – practice, research, lived experience, areas of specialisation, areas of expertise, other?

What physical space, resources and infrastructure can we contribute?

Who are the people we can bring to the partnership – specific staff, roles, champions, volunteers, community members, people with lived experience, other? What can each partner bring?

What **technology** can we contribute – computers, phones, ICT, systems, email accounts, other?

What information processes and systems can we bring - ways of disseminating information, protocols and processes, informal and formal ways of working, other? What **networks** can we give the partnership access to – sector specific, region specific, government, political, others?
